General Election 2024 – Bishop John Arnold, lead bishop on the environment, has written to the party leaders on the occasion of the forthcoming general election and here is an extract from what he says: “A general election is a very important time for reflection about the future direction of our country, and I would like to take this opportunity to bring to your attention the views of the Catholic Bishop's conference about the environment. Pope Francis has inspired us to take action on this matter, and many people will be taking environmental issues seriously in the election. The challenge of climate change is urgent and its effects are already being felt across the world often affecting the most vulnerable communities who have contributed least to the crisis. It can only be addressed by global co-operation together with support for those countries less able to afford a transition away from carbon intensive fuels...If this is not addressed, policies on the economy, housing and poverty will all be undermined by the physical impact of climate change. I would like to ask whether, if your party forms or participates in the next government, you will adopt credible policies to reduce net carbon emissions to zero by 2050 and also ensure that the UK government assists poorer countries to meet their targets and obligations. I would like to ask whether a government led by your party will provide clear international leadership in the global endeavour to reduce carbon emissions.”
