**A very Happy Feast Day to you all** – this weekend we mark the 265<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our community – the oldest in the diocese. We think of the day – June 29<sup>th</sup> 1759 – when Fr. Tom Norton officially set up a parish here to cover the areas of Leicestershire and Warwickshire and his dutiful and generous ministry to everyone (there were no motorized vehicles at that time so he had to walk everywhere) until his death in 1800. If you are out for a walk, you might care to look in at the graveyard in front of Aston Flamville church where you will see his remarkable gravestone and offer a small prayer of thanks for this wonderful man. There will be a barbecue and (hopefully) international celebration after the 11.30am Mass in Earl Shilton to which you will be welcome. We have also marked the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of St. Martin's School this week, another reason for a grateful celebration.
