**Out of the mouths....** – this is an extract from an essay attributed to an 8 year old from California, recorded by Fr. Brian D'Arcy in his weekly column in an Irish national newspaper:

“One of God’s main jobs is making people. He makes them to replace the ones that die so that there will be enough people to take care of things here on earth. I think he doesn’t make grown-ups, just babies because they are smaller and easier to make. That way, he doesn’t have to spend his valuable time teaching them to walk and talk. He can leave that to the mothers and fathers. God’s second most important job is listening to prayers. An awful lot of this goes on since some people, like preachers, pray at times other than bedtime. Because of this, God doesn’t have time to listen to the radio or TV. Since he hears everything, not only prayers, there must be a terrible lot of noise in his ears unless he has thought of a way to turn it off. God sees everything, hears everything and is everywhere, keeping him busy. So you shouldn’t waste his time by going over your parents’ heads asking for something they said you couldn’t have. His Dad (God) appreciated everything he had done and all his hard work on earth, so he told him he didn’t have to go out on the road anymore. He could stay in heaven. So he did. Now, he helps his Dad by listening to prayers and seeing which things are important for God to take care of, and which ones he can take care of himself without bothering God. Like a secretary, only it’s more important. If you don’t believe in God you will be very lonely. It is good to know he’s around you when you’re scared in the dark or can’t swim well and get thrown into deep water by big kids. But you shouldn’t always think about what God can do for you. I figure God put me here and he can take me back anytime he pleases. And that’s why I believe in God.”
