### From Pope Francis

"Dear grandmother, dear grandfather, dear elderly friends, in concluding this Message to you, I would also like to mention the example of Blessed (and soon Saint) Charles de Foucauld. He lived as a hermit in Algeria and there testified to "his desire to feel himself a brother to all" (Fratelli Tutti, 287). The story of his life shows how it is possible, even in the solitude of one's own desert, to intercede for the poor of the whole world and to become, in truth, a universal brother or sister. I ask the Lord that, also through his example, all of us may open our hearts in sensitivity to the sufferings of the poor and intercede for their needs. May each of us learn to repeat to all, and especially to the young, the words of consolation we have heard spoken to us today: "I am with you always"! Keep moving forward! May the Lord grant you his blessing. " (Message of Pope Francis for grandparents' day)

**News from The Vine:** As the Covid regulations have now been lifted it is now up to individual businesses as to what precautions they continue to take. Here at The Vine, we are keeping most of our precautions in place and prefer that customers continue to wear masks when they are moving around the premises. We have kept our social distancing signs up and are not putting any more tables on the coffee shop floor just yet. We are able to return to a counter service again for the coffee shop and ask that customers entering the building "give way" to anyone exiting it. We recommend that customers continue to either check in via the NHS Covid 19 app or leave their name and contact number with us - you won't be asked to self-isolate through doing this - if cases are found to have been at The Vine, you'll just be asked to do a lateral flow test. We are looking forward to opening once again on Saturdays - this will resume on September 4th when our Saturday opening will be from 9am - 2pm. The Vine will be closed for one day on Thursday 12th August due to staff absence and we apologise for any inconvenience.

**"I have my mission"** – this week, the Wednesday talk has begun a new and wide-ranging initiative to develop our parishes in the coming years, named after the words of St.John Henry Newman. It will involve the re-assessing and also rewriting of the programmes for Baptism, First Communion and Confirmation, with a view to making them more inclusive and interactive for everyone. There will also be a course of Adult formation, beginning next week for anyone who is interested in the Catholic and Christian faith and how we can live it in Our Lord's way in the 21<sup>st</sup> century. You will be able to follow the course on YouTube each Wednesday from 5.00pm and we hope it will be helpful.
