**A very Happy Feast Day to you all** – this weekend we mark the 265<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our community – the oldest in the diocese. We think of the day – June 29<sup>th</sup> 1759 – when Fr. Tom Norton officially set up a parish here to cover the areas of Leicestershire and Warwickshire and his dutiful and generous ministry to everyone (there were no motorized vehicles at that time so he had to walk everywhere) until his death in 1800. If you are out for a walk, you might care to look in at the graveyard in front of Aston Flamville church where you will see his remarkable gravestone and offer a small prayer of thanks for this wonderful man. There will be a barbecue and (hopefully) international celebration after the 11.30am Mass in Earl Shilton to which you will be welcome. We have also marked the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of St. Martin's School this week, another reason for a grateful celebration. Our children will lead the Mass on Sunday and in the coming week, we will be having our Summer Fair and Strawberry Tea (see below) before the school term draws to its close in a few days' time.

**"The Time is Now"** – is the title of what is called the "SPANNED Climate Change Manifesto", which we hope to publish in time for our bishop's visit on September 21<sup>st</sup>. It is not like any other 'manifesto' that is going the rounds at the moment (!!) but an actual promise of what we as an agency, Sunshine club, and St. Dominic's Community can actually do ourselves towards saving our planet from destruction. During the next few weeks, please think about these matters and let us know what initiatives you have taken personally (not what you think other people or governments should be doing). We want this to be a practical guide for everyone, so please send your thoughts into the Priory before the end of July if you can – it's amazing how inventive and creative many people can be!
